 - Email Monday, 14th of May, went out to YLA parent urging them to reach out to their State Representative and Congressmen
 - Virtual schools going from .65 to .35 funding application
 - Fear is that the next step would be the State doing the same to brick/mortar Charter facilities
 - Trust- State schools per pupil is higher than Charter schools + the State and District schools receive additional funding streams, where Charters school come from oneline item
 - Comparison: Charter School get \$12,891 per student. State schools get \$19,376 per student
 - Right now, State Legislators are struggling to understand how Charter schools are actually funded and the disparity, this is just a lack of knowledge.
 - This is will be big push for the YLA administration, to stay on top of funding and help educate State Legislators
